However, the silver lining was that thanks to Zoom we were able to connect the Madrinha family even more closely, and it was a joy to be able to put faces to the names we all knew so well. There were regular Cluster Catch Up meetings with each individual charity, their student mentees and Madrinha mentors which provided wonderful opportunities to really get to know each other.

Yet another Career Build Team initiative, the Buddy Programme, is proving to be a great success. The intensive workshops on varied subjects such as how to write an engaging CV, formulating a LinkedIn profile and how to develop transferable skills will help give our students the necessary skills to achieve that vital first step on the career ladder.

Our new partnership with Teach The Nation South Africa is also paying real dividends, not just for our Madrinha students. In November we hosted a 'Future Think Tank' – further details in this report, and we are indebted to delegates from the corporate, social and educational worlds whose insights will help us develop our strategic plan for the next few years.







Career Build Team Update

Ellie Patsalos (Trustee)



In 2021 the CBT's emphasis was on building skills and developing individual LinkedIn profiles and CVs to enable better opportunities in the workplace for all our mentees. By having well curated profiles our students are able to compete in the market to their best advantage and by understanding how to leverage their transferable skills are better equipped and have more confidence to secure internships and work experience opportunities as early as possible in their holidays and then after graduation.

New Partnership: Teach the Nation, South Africa (TTN SA)

On 5 May 2021 we confirmed our Partnership Agreement with TTN SA, David Oliphant CEO had hosted a few Zoom calls with his team and the Madrinha team full of all the positive energy of where this new partnership can and will take our students.

Each year TTN SA run their Fellowship Programme a very competitive two-year teaching programme where successful candidates - 'Fellows' - gain their PGCE teaching qualification as well as enhanced professional development skills and first-hand experience of community-based project work around the schools that they are assigned to.

TTN SA is part of the Teach for All global brand and Madrinha Trust is very proud to be partnered with them.

TTN SA & KHULA: Fellowship Programme @ KHULA's schools

In Autumn of 2020 Jania connected Madrinha Trust with the Teach for All programme and we are overjoyed to confirm our new partnership with Teach the Nation SA (ABOVE) which has resulted in them partnering with KHULA and setting up a combined Fellowship Programme starting Jan 2022 based out of KHULA's 21 schools in KwaZulu-Natal.

The ambition is that Madrinha scholars will become Fellows on this combined Fellowship Programme and gain their PGCE teaching certificate plus professional development skills along the way to ensure a great start in their chosen careers.

Career Focused Buddy Programme (BP): Pilot Jan to July 2021

As part of the CBT initiative, we realised the skills gap was widening and that mentees needed hand-holding through the CV writing process and LinkedIn profile development. A younger team of mentors from the CBT collaborated with our Trust Manager S-J and our new Trustee Vanessa Kyte, an experienced business leader within the technology industry where she spent 17 years at Microsoft, currently working at Apple. S-J and Vanessa put together a framework for the 2021 BP focusing on a seven month programme of career focused workshops and support "buddy" groups led by an experienced volunteer corporate Buddy Leader to prepare mentees for the competitive job market. The idea is that by putting mentees into small groups of 6 we also encourage a peer to peer buddying up self-help group who help each other researching local corporate opportunities, internships, work placements.


Madrinha Trust Mentee Awards

Buddy Programme 2021

We were excited to announce the completion of our first six-month career focused Buddy Programme, connecting 30 of our graduating students with volunteer young professionals, helping them transition from university into the workplace. By enabling mentees to develop core skills from each workshop attended, the aim is to build their confidence and knowledge on how to positively approach finding a job in a competitive market.

- 30 graduating students divided into seven Buddy Groups by territory and partner charity
- Each Buddy Group has a Buddy Leader and a nominated mentee 'captain' representing their group
- The six-month Buddy Programme includes one monthly workshop hosted by a volunteer speaker from each of the disciplines
- Buddy Groups provided with a communication platform for homework and discussion around the workshops
- Mentor and Buddy Leader alignment is essential to support the mentees in the buddy groups
- Encourages peer to peer support, collaboration and sharing of best practice and experiences by learning from each other along this programme
- By enabling mentees to develop core skills from each workshop attended, it will build their confidence and knowledge of how to positively approach finding a job in a competitive market.

A guest presentation from Francois Pienaar (Founder) and Hellete Pieterse (CEO) from our partner charity, MAD Leadership Foundation, also gave informed insight into how to formulate our future thinking for 2022.

Future Think Tank 2021 Corporate Engagement



Successful collaborations have been established with these organisations:

- Partnership with TTN SA has created three internships and three campus ambassadors
- Fellowship Programme with Teach the Nation (TTN SA) and KHULA charity, two Madrinha graduates accepted, starting Jan 2022 plus three others from KHULA and TTN SA.
- Film Afrika, SA offering internships / work placements in 2022
- Microsoft SA are looking for regional engagements for opportunities for Computer Science graduates
- Four volunteers from Apple are Buddy Leaders as part of our career focused seven-month Buddy Programme (Jan to July 2021) all wishing to engage again with Madrinha for the 2022 Buddy Programme
- Entrepreneur Workshops with Paul Spiers (Leadership Skills) and Aurora (Start Up Programmes) to encourage start up ideas enabling alternate source of income.

Future Think Tank Purpose

- 6. How can our mentees access 'out of reach' networks and stand out against competition when applying for graduate schemes, internships and entry-level positions?





Appendix 1: Fundraising Activities

The Madrinha Trust's investment objective is to achieve "Real returns on a rolling five-year view with emphasis on income with capital growth". As global interest rates have fallen to all-time lows, the yield of the portfolio has been impacted. Over the last 5 years most of the total return has come from capital appreciation. The current income yield of the portfolio is ~1%.

Over the 5-year period to 31st December 2021 the portfolio has generated an annualised return of 9.2%, whilst the return objective (CPI +3%) has equated to +4.9%. Over the same period the Peer group (as measure by ARC Steady Growth Charity Index) has generated an annualised return of +6.5%. This is in the context of Global Equities (MSCI AC World Index) annualising at 12.1% and UK 1-10 year Corporate Bonds (BofA ICE Sterling Corporates) annualising at 3.0%.

Year to 31st October 2021, the Madrinha Trust's portfolio has generated a return of +11.6%. Over the same period the Peer group (as measure by ARC Steady Growth Charity Index) has generated a return of 9.1%. This is in the context of Global Equities (MSCI AC World Index) returning 16.5% and UK 1-10 year Corporate Bonds (BofA ICE Sterling Corporates) returning -1.7%.

Appendix 3: Our Trust Board Committees

TRUST BOARD

The trust is run by a group of trustees who operate under UK Charities law and the guidelines of the Charities Commission. We hold three trustee meetings each year, attended by all trustees in the presence of a Chair and Treasurer. Each has a structured agenda and in addition to monitoring good governance of the Trust, we share ideas and practices to maintain alignment with our core vision, mission and our values. We live by our ethos.

EXCO

A small number of Trustees are empowered by the Trust Board to meet a further three times per year to enable a faster decision-making process. In addition, the EXCO also reviews in a timely fashion financial details and operational actions. The EXCO reports back to the Trustees three times per year at the Board of Trustees.

EDUCATION and MENTORING COMMITTEE (E&M)

To ensure we have an undiluted focus on mentee selection, appointment, monitoring and development we have established this committee with two trustees leading. They meet three times per year and drive all mentee activity and ensure their alignment to our ethos. They report back to the Board at Trustee meetings.

CAREER BUILD TEAM (CBT)

The CBT was set up in early 2020 and its objective is to assist our students to find internships and jobs. With the challenges facing all graduates globally in finding suitable employment, the problem is exacerbated in developing countries. The pandemic and its global adverse economic impact has made things more difficult. We endeavour to work closely with multinational corporates with a footprint similar to ours and agree a process to give opportunities to our graduates. The CBT meets before the E&M meetings and comprises of a team of volunteers focused on building corporate partnerships. They report to the Board at Trustee meetings.
